The Annual Serial Landmark International (ASLI) conferences on QoL for 2015, **AQoL 2015Izmir** with the "Quality of Life 2" as the main theme managed to attract an overall total of 43 numbers of approved abstracts. Those finally transformed into 30 approved full papers for this Proceeding. Two of the papers declined at the last minute.

About the Conference

Background

Such indicators involve both subjective and objective measures. Although voluminous studies have been held, no clear findings have been revealed (as expected in relation to its interdisciplinary and wide content). Given that more work are on call to understand the concept of QoL.

The AQoL2015Izmir, contributes to the debate and solutions on the QoL by exploring QoL issues for the whole world population in general, and Asian populations in particular.
